1 Creator God,

Reading John 18:33–38

- 1 There is one gospel on which I stand for all eternity: it is my story, my Father's plan the Son has rescued me! Oh what a gospel, oh what a peace my highest joy and my deepest need. Now and forever he is my light: I stand in the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- 2 There is one gospel to which I cling all else I count as loss, for there, where justice and mercy meet he saved me on the cross. No more I boast in what I can bring, no more I carry the weight of sin, for he has brought me from death to life— I stand in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

- 3 There in the ground his body lay: Light of the world by darkness slain. Then bursting forth in glorious day, up from the grave he rose again! And as he stands in victory, sin's curse has lost its grip on me, for I am his and he is mine bought with the precious blood of Christ.
- 4 No guilt in life, no fear in death; this is the power of Christ in me; from life's first cry to final breath Jesus commands my destiny. No power of hell, no scheme of man can ever pluck me from his hand: till he returns or calls me home, here in the power of Christ I'll stand!
