

### John chapters 1-10

# Jesus is God himself ...come to bring his new creation ...and rescue a new people

In the section of John's gospel that we're looking at this term we see who Jesus is and what he has come to do.

#### Are you in or out?

John's gospel calls for a decision. We all need to decide if we will receive or reject Jesus who has come to give eternal life.

#### **Memory verse**

This is the verse from John that we'll be learning this term.

"Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God" John 1v12



#### Using the material – a guide for parents

This term, rather than give out Take Home Sheets we've put together a little study for each week of Sunday School.

We hope these studies will help you:

- To know what we've been teaching in Sunday school so you can talk to your child about it and pray for them as they hear of the Lord Jesus from John's gospel
- To give you an opportunity to dig into the passage with your child and clarify or build their understanding
- To give you an opportunity to help your child think through further how they are responding to what they're hearing in God's word.

We hope that this will enable us to better partner with you as you continue you to teach your children about the Lord Jesus.

You could go through the study over a meal time or at bedtime. You could also do the study over a whole week, doing a question each day. Why not get into the habit of praying with your children, asking for God's help, before you start the study. Then cover as much of the study as you feel able to with the age and attention span of your children.

Here are some ideas:

- For small children, you might choose to just look at the story recap, the first 'look' question and then to pray.
- Slightly older children might be able to look at one of the 'think' questions too, and the oldest may manage to cover all the questions.
- If you have older children, who want to go further than the study, you could read the rest of the passage (full passage indicated in at the top of each page) with them and think together what it adds to our understanding of the big idea.

#### Week1: John 1:1-18

### God himself has come! God is coming to bring life

This term we're looking at the gospel of John. John was a disciple of Jesus– in-fact, he was Jesus' best friend. John wrote his gospel because he wanted his readers to know something very important. He decided to write a book about the most important person who has ever lived: Jesus. There are lots of things John could have written about Jesus. He could have written a book about what Jesus looked like, or a book about Jesus' favourite foods. But John carefully chose some very special things to help his readers see something important: that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God. He did this because he knew, if people believed this, they would become children of God; and as a child of God they would have good, joyful, everlasting life.

This week John starts his gospel with a summary (an overview) of what he will say. The creator God is coming into the world to bring new life; would people receive him or reject him?



#### Week 2 : John 1:19-51

#### God himself has come! Jesus is THE Promised One

As we read John's gospel, we need to remember that God's people had been waiting for hundreds of years for the amazing things God had promised through his prophets in the Old Testament. God had promised that someone special would come - the Promised One. The Promised One would be God himself. He would bring in an amazing new creation and rescue a new people to live with him there. The waiting was like a long drumroll getting faster and louder. Everyone was getting excited, waiting for the cymbal to crash when the Promised One arrived. But then, in this week's passage, a man called John arrives. Everyone gets really excited! Is this him? Is this God's Promised One? No. John's not the Promised One but it's really exciting that he's arrived because of the special job that he has come to do. John says he is the one who's here to prepare the way of the Lord. he's here to get people ready for the promised one and point to him when he arrives. And then, CRASH! The drumroll stops and we hear the cymbal. Look - He's here! Says John. The promised One has FINALLY arrived!



#### Week 3 : John 2:1-11

# God himself has come... To bring his new creation Jesus is the bridegroom

The signs in John's gospel show us who Jesus is so that we might believe in him. The first sign Jesus did was at a wedding. Unfortunately the bridegroom at this wedding hadn't bought enough wine and it run out - oh no, the party had to stop! But Jesus fixed it, he turned some water into wine (phew), Jesus did the job of the bridegroom; it's like he became the bridegroom.

In the Old Testament God called himself a bridegroom. He promised that one day he would marry his people. He promised that he would love them and care for them and bring them into his new creation.

Jesus turning water into wine is a sign. The sign shows us that Jesus is God— the bridegroom of his Gods people. This was the start of a whole new age. The bridegroom had come to marry his people. This is only the first sign, but already the disciples of Jesus believed him.



# God himself has come... To bring his new creation Jesus is the judging King

Today's story involves the temple. The temple was very special because it was the place where God came to live with his people. It was where people made sacrifices so that their sin could be forgiven and they could have a relationship with God.

But the temple couldn't do this completely. It was just a picture pointing forward to something even better. It was pointing to a time when sins would be forgiven *completely* and when God could live with his people in perfect relationship *forever*.

When Jesus enters the temple in our story he is rightly angry. He sees how the temple, the 'old way', can't fix our relationship with God. Jesus has come to judge the 'old way' and bring in the new thing it pointed to. Jesus has come to replace the temple with himself. He's going to do what is needed to fix people's relationship with God forever. When he dies, his death will pay for sin (so we don't need loads of sacrifices). His death is going to mean that God can actually live with his people in his new creation forever.





#### Week 5 : John 3

## God himself has come... To bring his new creation How to get eternal life - be born again

How can we enter God's kingdom? How can we be a part of God's new creation and receive eternal life?

Today Jesus tells us the answer. To get inside God's kingdom we must be born again! That is what Jesus told Nicodemus when they met one night time. What a surprise for Nicodemus! He was a well-respected, important teacher in Israel. He knew all about God's law and all about the Old Testament. He tried to do what God wanted. But none of these things meant he was inside God's kingdom. That is not how it works with God. To get inside God's kingdom, Nicodemus needed a new birth. God needed to change him on the inside, to take away his sinful heart and give him a new heart. To be born again Nicodemus needed to believe in Jesus.

## God himself has come... To bring his new creation Jesus offers eternal life - to anyone!

Last time we were thinking about how can we get inside God's kingdom. We saw that to get inside God's kingdom, to be a part of God's new creation and receive eternal life we must be born again! Today we're going to think about who can be inside God's kingdom.

In our story, Jesus meets a woman by a well in a place called Samaria. Jews, like Jesus, normally didn't like Samaritans. What's more, she hadn't lived a very good life. Even her own people didn't want to know her. She seemed like the opposite to religious and respected Nicodemus in our last story

But.... Jesus offers her the most amazing thing in the world. He offers her living water. Not water like you have with your lunch—Jesus is using water as a picture for life. What Jesus offers is eternal life and he offers it to this woman. The woman comes to believe who Jesus is and tells her whole town too! So who can have eternal life? Who can be inside God's kingdom? Anyone can! Anyone who believes.

#### Week 7 : John 4:42-54

## God himself has come... To bring his new creation Jesus gives new life, just by speaking

A boy was sick. He was dying. His father, a royal official, heard that Jesus had come back to Cana again, where he had turned water into wine. The boy's father rushed to see Jesus. He begged Jesus to come and heal his son. But Jesus didn't come, instead he said to the man, "Go, your son shall live."

So the man went. On the way home he was met by some of his servants. They had good news. His boy was alive! Amazing! When did he get better? They replied, "Yesterday, at one in the afternoon." This was the exact time that Jesus had said, "Your son shall live."

All Jesus did was speak. With his words Jesus gave life to a boy who was nearly dead. He wasn't even near him. Remember how in the beginning God created everything just by speaking. He spoke and there was life. This sign shows us that Jesus is the creator God who gives new life.





#### Week 8 : John 5 God himself has come to bring his new creation... And rescue a new people Jesus gives eternal life - even though he's rejected

Remember right back in the beginning of the bible, in Genesis, God the Father gave life to everything. He just spoke, and there was life. Last time we saw that Jesus, God's Son, spoke and gave new life to a boy who was dying. In today's story Jesus heals a man who had been lame, that means he couldn't walk, for 38 years. Jesus heals him just by his words! But... the Jewish leaders are really angry at Jesus. What? Why? They were angry because they think he shouldn't be working on the Sabbath. On one day every week people had a day away from their work. Only God worked on the Sabbath. Now Jesus, God's Son, is doing the same work as his Father. Jesus tells us that the work of God his Father is to give life to people but also to punish all who are against him. God does this work by speaking his powerful words and now Jesus does the same work as his Father. Jesus has the same job as God, giving life and judging. So the Jewish leaders who reject Jesus are rejecting God himself who gives life.



#### Week 9 : John 6

#### God himself has come to bring his new creation... And rescue a new people Jesus gives eternal life - by rescuing us

Last time we heard that Jesus is God's Son and he does the same work as his Father. In John chapter 6 we hear about something else Jesus did which is similar to what his Father did a long time ago. There are three clues in this chapter to help us look back to the Old Testament: it was Passover time, there was bread to eat in the middle of nowhere, and some water was crossed in an unusual and amazing way. What does it remind you of? The Exodus! When God rescued his people out of slavery in Egypt.

Well, Jesus shows us that just like God rescued his people then, Jesus has come to earth to rescue people too. Jesus hasn't come to rescue people from Egypt or Pharaoh or anything like that. Jesus came to earth to rescue us from our sin and from the punishment of death our sins deserve.

#### Week 10 : John 6

### God himself has come to bring his new creation... And rescue a new people Jesus gives eternal life - this matters most

In our last story Jesus fed 5000 people with just a few loaves of bread in the middle of nowhere. This shows us that, just like God rescued his people in the Exodus, Jesus has came to earth to rescue people too. Jesus came to earth to rescue us from our sin and from the punishment of death that our sins deserve. The next day, the crowds of people come back to Jesus again -they want some more bread to fill their tummies! But Jesus says to them "I am the bread of life". We need food, like bread, keeps us alive. Without it we die! But we need Jesus to keep us alive even more than food. Jesus says he is the bread of life because he can keep us alive. The life Jesus gives people is eternal life.

Jesus gives us what matters the most, eternal life. It might seem that other things are more important most of the time. Things like sports or friends or food! But believing in Jesus is the most important thing. He gives us eternal life.

#### Week 11 : John 7

#### God himself has come to bring his new creation... And rescue a new people Jesus is the rejected rescuer

It was festival time and lots of people were in Jerusalem. Everyone was talking about Jesus. John tells us what the people thought as they whispered amongst themselves. Some said, "He is a good man". Others disagreed. "He's a bad man. He deceives people." Some said to Jesus "You are demon-possessed." But others in the crowd said the opposite; they said "He is the Messiah." That is the king sent by God to rescue. Who was right? Who is Jesus?

The Jewish leaders thought they knew better than anyone. The Jewish leaders thought that Jesus was not from God and he must be stopped. He had broken their laws and was even saying he was God's Son. This man must die, they thought. Right from the beginning of the festival they were looking for a way to kill Jesus! They thought they were right and the others were wrong. But what do you think? Who is Jesus?

#### Week 12 : John 8:12-59


## God himself has come to bring his new creation... And rescue a new people God's true people accept his Son, Jesus

In today's story, Jesus is still in the temple talking to the Jewish leaders. The Jewish leaders thought that Jesus was not from God and he must be stopped. They were looking for a way to kill him! As we carry on reading we see even more that these Jewish people, God's people in the Old Testament, have totally rejected Jesus. Their rejection of Jesus shows who they really are - they're not God's true people at all. They don't belong to his family if they hate his Son. They thought that because they were related to Abraham, they were automatically in God's kingdom. They thought that they didn't need him. They didn't think they needed a rescuer. They had failed to see that rejecting God's son meant they were not part of God's family and would not have eternal life with him.

Jesus is rejected by his own people but Jesus offers eternal life to anyone! He has come to rescue a people, a new people to live in God's new creation forever. Anyone who loves and accepts Jesus, God's Son are God's true people and belong to God's family.

#### Week 13 : John 9 God himself has come to bring his new creation... And rescue a new people Jesus opens our eyes so we see who he is

In John chapter 9 Jesus tells us that he's got some work to do. This work is very important. I wonder what it might be. To show us what work he is doing Jesus does another sign. As he was walking along he saw a man who was born blind. This man had been blind all his life. He couldn't see anything. Jesus spat on the ground, made some mud, and put it on the man's eyes. After the man went to wash in a pool he could see - his eyes were open! The Pharisees didn't like it that Jesus had opened the mans eyes because Jesus had done it on the Sabbath. They asked the man "who did this?" and who he thought Jesus was. At first he wasn't too sure, but gradually he came to realise that Jesus was God himself. Jesus hadn't just opened the mans physical eyes. Remember, this was a sign to show us something about Jesus. This shows us that Jesus opens peoples spiritual eyes, so that people can understand who he really is. This is the important work that Jesus is doing right now. We are all born spiritually blind. But Jesus is opening spiritually blind eyes.

#### Week 14 : John 10

#### God himself has come to bring his new creation... And rescue a new people Jesus' people listen to his words


We've been hearing the amazing news in John's gospel that anyone who accepts Jesus, God's Son, is rescued to be part of his new people and to be with him in his new creation. Last time we saw that Jesus opens our blind eyes so that we can see who he really is.

In today's story, we get three pictures: the good shepherd, the gate to the sheep pen and the shepherd's sheep. Jesus says that he is the Good Shepherd who will rescue his sheep by dying for them. He loves them and won't abandon them. Jesus is not like the bad shepherds, the Jewish leaders that we've seen reject him. They don't care for God's people. Jesus also says he is the gate to the sheep pen because he's the only way to be in God's kingdom. Lastly, Jesus talks about the sheep. There will be lots of bad shepherds trying to tell the sheep lies and trick them with wrong ways to get into the kingdom. But Jesus says his sheep know his voice, they will only follow him.
