•	Personally be unashamed of gospel proclamation, Romans 1
	<ul> <li>Paul is under obligation to preach the gospel to all kinds of people, 1:14–17</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Acts help us understand what Paul is getting at—see his commission by king Jesus in Acts 9, his preaching to the Athenian idol-worshippers and philosophers in Acts 17, his offer of salvation to the Philippian jailer in Acts 16</li> </ul>
	Paul is unashamed of the gospel—am !?
	<ul> <li>1 Corinthians 1:22–25 and 8:1–11:1 helps us understand more of what Paul is getting at—not least as Pau writes from Corinth (in the three months he spent in Greece in Acts 20:2–3, staying with Gaius there in Romans 16:23 and 1 Corinthians 1:14)</li> </ul>

• Paul is unashamed of the crucified King Jesus and Paul is an example to us—even if people don't believe

<ul> <li>This gospel is needed because everyone has supressed truth about God</li> </ul>
Paul is unashamed of this gospel which rescues people—am !?
<ul> <li>Corporately be partners in Gospel proclamation, Romans 15</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Having preached around the Mediterranean, Paul is off to Spain via Jerusalem and Rome, 15:18–20 and 24–28</li> </ul>
■ Will the Romans help him 15:24, 28, 32?—to preach where Christ is not known v20
Do we understand Romans enough to have a similar ambition and concern for partnership?
Who could you join with to enable unashamed-speaking-of-Jesus where he is least known?
